



Sydney to Adelaide trip for Inspiration

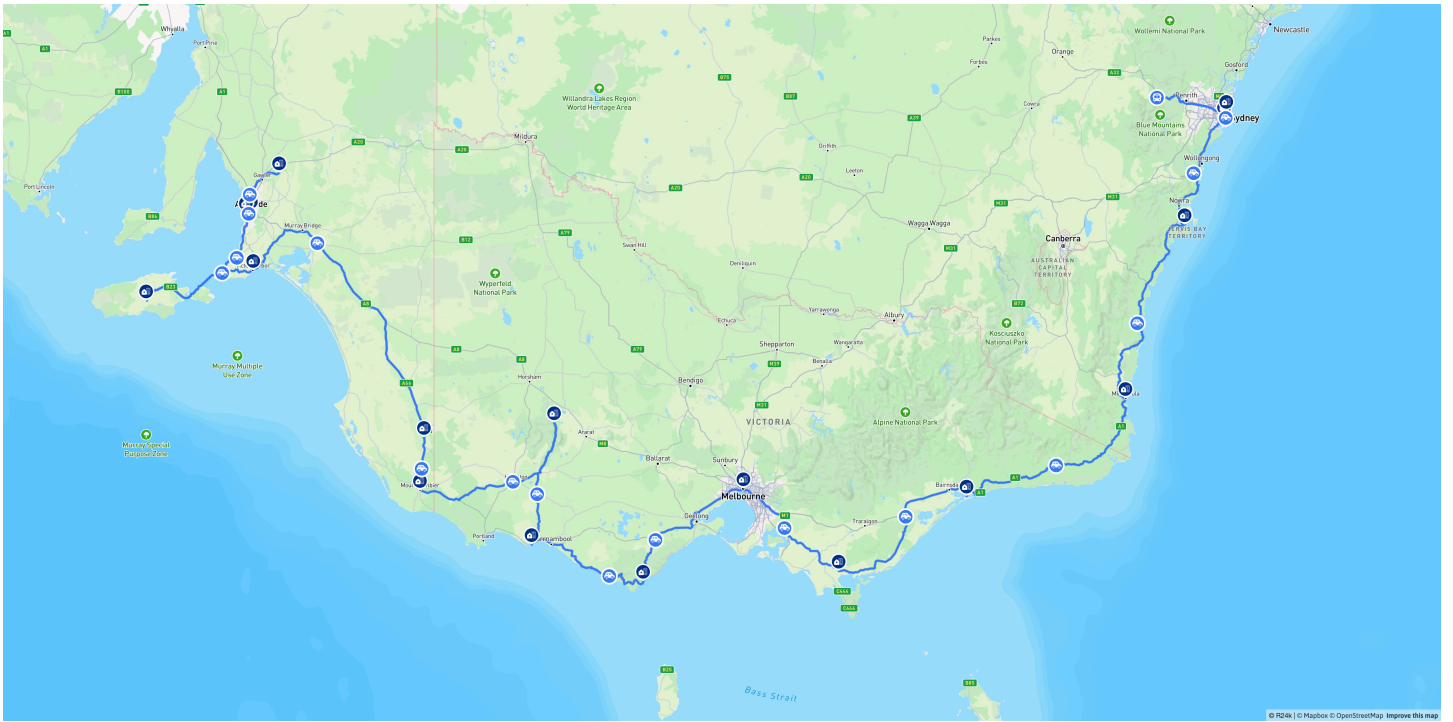
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Intro

Australia's east and south coasts offer one of the world's great road journeys, and this 25-day adventure takes you through the full sweep of it. From the vibrant energy of Sydney, you drive south along a coastline of dazzling white sand bays and ancient national parks, through the maritime elegance of the Gippsland Lakes, into the raw wilderness of Wilsons Promontory, and on to the cultural capital Melbourne. From there, the Great Ocean Road unfolds in all its drama, past thundering surf beaches, ancient rainforests, and the iconic limestone stacks of the Twelve Apostles.

The second half of the journey leads deeper into South Australia, where the mood shifts to wide open farmland, extinct volcanoes, and world-class wine country. You cross to Kangaroo Island, one of the finest wildlife sanctuaries on earth, before heading into the Barossa Valley for a full day of cellar doors and regional cuisine, and finally arriving in Adelaide for a graceful farewell to this extraordinary continent. Along the way, the encounters range from wild sea lions on deserted beaches to koalas in the treetops, from Aboriginal rock art in the Grampians to a horse-drawn tram rattling over a granite island off the Southern Ocean coast.

Leisure in Sydney: Discover Bondi Beach and its surroundings

Today you have the day at your disposal, perfect for exploring one of Sydney's most famous coastal regions: Bondi Beach. The world-famous city beach is not only a paradise for surfers but also ideal for walking, sunbathing, or enjoying a coffee with a view of the sea.

Particularly worth it is the picturesque coastal walk from Bondi to Coojee. The route leads along spectacular cliffs, past small coves, natural seawater pools, and repeatedly offers breathtaking views of the Pacific Ocean.

For those who prefer a quieter pace, the day can be spent leisurely in Bondi with a visit to the Icebergs Ocean Pool, a stroll through the small boutiques, or lunch in one of the many cafés and restaurants with a view of the water.

Alternatively, you can spend the day in the city: take a guided city tour, visit the famous Sydney Opera House, or if the weather is good, embark on a guided bridge climb over the Sydney Harbour Bridge, an unforgettable experience with spectacular views.

Depending on your interests and the season, a boat tour is also an option. At the end of November, there is still a chance, with a bit of luck, to observe whales off the coast of Sydney, particularly Southern Right Whales and Humpback Whales, which are on their way back to southern waters. An ideal day to discover Sydney's diversity of nature, culture, and urban life.

DAY 3: Sydney

Blue Mountains Day Trip

Embark on a full-day adventure to the stunning Blue Mountains, starting with a visit to Echo Point for breathtaking views of the rugged cliffs and the famous rock formation of the Three Sisters.

If you're feeling adventurous, take the optional Scenic World experience, where you can ride the Scenic Railway, the steepest passenger railway in the world, or the glass-bottomed Scenic Skyway to enjoy panoramic views of the Jamison Valley.

In the afternoon, visit the Featherdale Wildlife Park, where you can have a close encounter with native Australian wildlife, including kangaroos, koalas, and emus, and provide a true outback experience just outside the city.

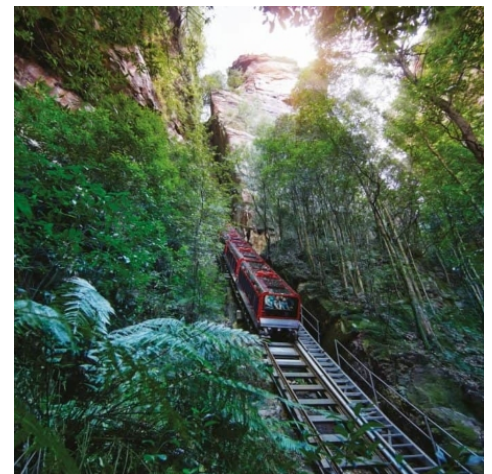
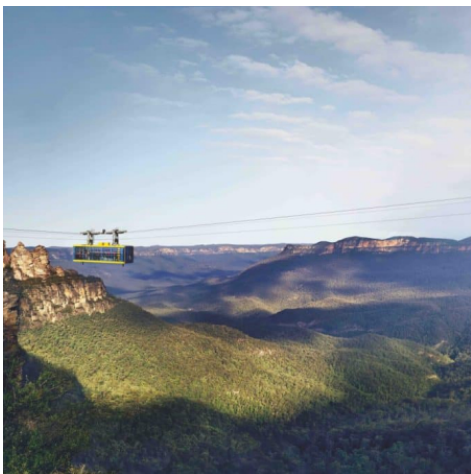

DAY 4: Sydney - Vincentia

From the opera to the turquoise sea

In the morning, you pick up your rental car in Sydney and slowly leave the hustle and bustle of the city behind. The route takes you first through the Royal National Park – a green oasis with cliffs, eucalyptus forests, and small hiking trails. Those who wish can make a quick stop at the Wattamolla Falls or at Bald Hill, where hang gliders leap off the slope and the view over the coast is breathtaking.

Further south, a stop at the Sea Cliff Bridge is worthwhile – a spectacular coastal road that winds like a sculpture above the sea. The small coastal town of Kiama with its natural blowhole also offers a nice opportunity for a break. In the afternoon, you will reach Jervis Bay (Vincentia) – a marine reserve with white sand, crystal-clear water, and a relaxed atmosphere. Here you will stay for two nights.

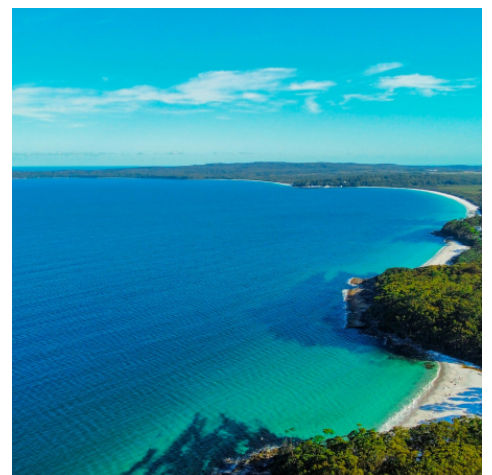

DAY 5: Vincentia

Silent beaches and old stories

A whole day to experience the magic of Jervis Bay. The sheltered bay with its almost unreal white sand and turquoise blue water invites you to take a breath. Early in the morning, Hyams Beach is particularly quiet - ideal for a walk with bare feet in the sand. Those who wish can later take part in a boat tour for dolphin watching or paddle through the calm waters in a kayak.

A special highlight is the visit to Booderee National Park, which is jointly managed with the Wreck Bay Aboriginal Community. Guided walks here tell stories of traditional healing plants, ancient trade routes, and the spiritual significance of the land. The park's gardens are also worth a visit - they showcase the close connection between nature and culture. Depending on the season, small events or performances take place, bringing Indigenous perspectives to life. The day

concludes with the sound of the sea and a glass of wine - perhaps from the Shoalhaven region, whose wineries are located north of the bay.

DAY 6: Vincentia - Merimbula

Coastal paths and animal encounters

You continue your journey southwards, following one of the most beautiful coastal routes in Australia. The road winds through dense forests, small villages, and along rugged bays. A worthwhile stop is Narooma, known for its seals that often bask on the rocks at Bar Rock. Those who are inclined can make a detour to Tilba Tilba – a lovingly restored village from the 19th century with craft shops and tea houses.

Just before Merimbula lies the small wildlife sanctuary Potoroo Palace – an ideal place to get up close to local animals like kangaroos, emus, wombats, and of course the shy long-nosed potoroos. The facility emphasizes education and species-appropriate husbandry and is run in a very personal manner. (<https://www.potoroopalace.com>)

In the afternoon, you reach Merimbula, a relaxed coastal town with lagoons, sandy beaches, and good restaurants. The area is famous for its oyster farming – a tasting directly from the farm jetty is a true experience. For an evening walk, the boardwalk along the water is perfect, where pelicans and herons search for food among the mangroves.

DAY 7: Merimbula - Metung

Gentle lakes and maritime elegance

After breakfast, you leave Merimbula and continue your drive through the green hinterland of Victoria. The road passes by hilly farmlands, ancient eucalyptus trees, and now and then the sea appears on the horizon. Along the way, places like Eden – with its small whaling museum – or the quiet beaches around Mallacoota invite you to take a break.

In the afternoon, you reach Metung, an elegant village on the shores of the Gippsland Lakes. Here, a relaxed maritime atmosphere prevails: sailboats in the harbor, herons in the river meadows, sunsets over the water. Perhaps you will take a walk along the promenade or end the day with a glass of wine while overlooking the water. The accommodations are stylish, quiet, and mostly with direct lake views – ideal for a relaxing evening.

DAY 8: Metung - Foster


In the wilderness of the south - Wilsons Promontory National Park

Today you will set off early to drive south to Wilsons Promontory National Park – one of the most scenic sections of the Australian south coast. The drive takes you through small villages and open farmland before suddenly revealing wide bays and forested hills ahead of you. On your way to the park, you may encounter emus, wombats, or kangaroos by the roadside, if you're lucky.

Your accommodation is either located directly in the park or near the entrance – depending on availability. The afternoon offers initial exploration opportunities: a walk on Squeaky Beach with its squeaking sand, a short trail to a viewpoint, or simply a mindful immersion in the tranquility of this protected landscape. In the evening it becomes quiet – no street noise, no cell reception, just wind, sea, and stars.

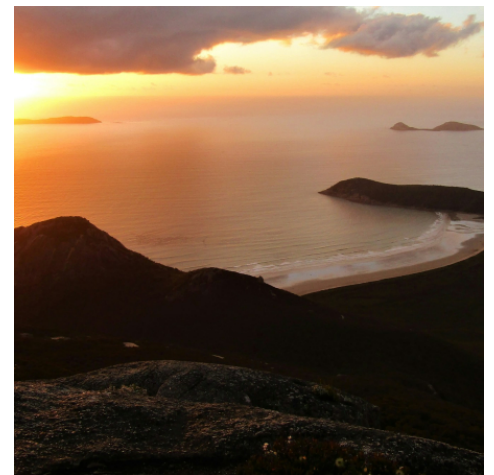

DAY 9: Foster

Experience wilderness on foot

After breakfast in Foster, you will set off on a day trip to Wilsons Promontory National Park. The drive to the park entrance takes about 20 minutes – perfect for an early start. Once there, you will find numerous well-marked hiking trails for all levels: from a leisurely walk through the Tidal River Plain to a more active tour up Mount Oberon with wide views over the coast, sea, and forests.

For those who prefer a more relaxed pace, you can unwind on one of the pristine beaches like Whisky Bay or Picnic Bay, dip your feet in the water, and enjoy the tranquility. With a bit of luck, you might encounter wombats, wallabies, or even a curious echidna along the trails.

In the afternoon, return to Foster. Perhaps there will still be time for a little stroll through the town or a dinner featuring local products at one of the local restaurants.

DAY 10: Foster - Melbourne

From the bush to the boulevards

Today you leave the tranquil nature of the South and head towards Australia's cultural capital. The drive to Melbourne takes about three hours, with the option to stop in small towns like Leongatha or Korumburra along the way. Around noon, you approach the suburbs of the metropolis – a soft, almost imperceptible transition from eucalyptus forest to urban landscape.

Your accommodation is the historic Hotel Windsor, an elegant establishment in Victorian style that has been welcoming guests since 1883. Located directly on Collins Street, it gives you access to Melbourne's theater district, high-end boutiques, and excellent cafés. The afternoon is free for you to enjoy – perhaps for a first stroll through the downtown arcades or an aperitif in one of the many hidden bars that offer exciting concepts and exquisite wines behind unassuming doors.

DAY 11: Melbourne

Coffee, contrasts, and creative corners

A whole day to explore Melbourne on your own - or with a guided tour if you wish. The city is regarded as Australia's center for design, architecture, and gastronomy. Start your day with a flat white in one of the trendy cafes around Degraves Street or hidden in the laneways that weave like little secrets through the center.

Particularly worth seeing: the National Gallery of Victoria with its changing exhibitions, the modern Docklands, or a detour to the green Fitzroy Gardens. For those who prefer shopping, there is an exciting range between high-end and local design around Bourke Street Mall and Collins Street.

In the afternoon, a visit to the neighborhoods of Fitzroy or Carlton is recommended - young, creative, full of street art, second-hand shops, and good Italian cuisine. Or you can end the day stylishly at the Hotel Windsor with a classic afternoon tea.

DAY 12: Melbourne - Apollo Bay

From Melbourne to Apollo Bay: Coastal beauties and surfer paradises

Let's go on the journey to the Great Ocean Road.

The first stop on your way takes you to Torquay, the birthplace of Australian surfing. Here you can visit the famous Bells Beach, one of the most well-known surf beaches in the world, and enjoy the breathtaking view of the vast sea while walking

along the cliffs.

Additionally, you should definitely head to the golf course in Anglesea. Many groups of kangaroos actually live wild here. For just \$20 per person, a volunteer from the golf club will take you around in a golf buggy to admire the kangaroos up close.

Continue along the coast and drive through the idyllic landscape of the Otway National Park, which captivates you with its dense forests and lush green hills. On the way to Apollo Bay, you can stop by the Split Point Lighthouse and the beautiful beaches of Aireys Inlet. A short stop at Lorne Pier offers you the opportunity to admire the picturesque coast from a different perspective. The charming village of Lorne is known for its Victorian architecture and is an ideal place for a coffee break.

On your journey, you will also pass the Kennet River Caravan Park, where koalas hang around in the trees. You will also find many parrots there.

In the afternoon, you will finally reach Apollo Bay, a quiet coastal town surrounded by the gentle hills of the Otway National Park. Take the opportunity to explore Apollo Bay Harbour or enjoy a relaxing walk on the beach. The stunning view of the turquoise water and green hills makes this place a perfect destination to enjoy the day and look forward to the next adventures along the Great Ocean Road.

DAY 13: Apollo Bay - Port Fairy

Great Ocean Road

In the morning, you start in Apollo Bay and drive along the famous Great Ocean Road. The route takes you through the Great Otway National Park, where dense rainforests and tall eucalyptus trees shape the landscape. Be sure to make a stop at the

Maits Rest Rainforest Walk, a short but impressive stroll through the lush rainforest. Along the way, you can also visit the Cape Otway Lightstation, the oldest lighthouse in Australia, which offers spectacular views of the coast.

In the afternoon, you will reach the famous Twelve Apostles, the majestic limestone formations that rise from the turquoise sea. Take your time to admire the impressive cliffs and rock formations from various viewpoints. If you wish, you can book a short helicopter flight to experience the stunning beauty of this coast from above. Also, visit the Loch Ard Gorge, a dramatic gorge that recalls a tragic shipwreck from the 19th century.

In the evening, you continue your journey along the Great Ocean Road and arrive in Port Fairy, a charming fishing village with historic buildings and a relaxed atmosphere. End the day with a cozy dinner in one of the local restaurants and enjoy a walk along the harbor or at East Beach. The tranquil mood of the place invites you to reflect on the day's experiences and look forward to the next adventures on the Australian south coast.

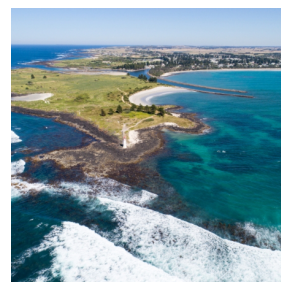
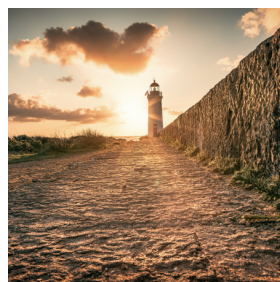
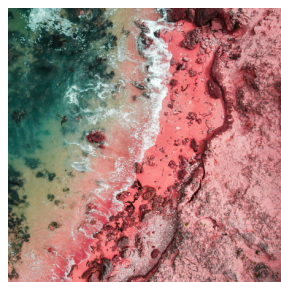

DAY 14: Port Fairy

Your day today is free for you in Port Fairy - ideal for exploring the surroundings at your own pace.

If you enjoy being in nature, we recommend a trip to the nearby Tower Hill Wildlife Reserve. This conservation area is located in an extinct volcanic crater and offers a fascinating landscape with lakes, bushland, and lava rock.

Well-signposted hiking trails lead through the reserve - perfect for observing kangaroos, emus, koalas, and many bird species in the wild. With a bit of luck, you may encounter the animals up close.

Back in Port Fairy, you can unwind at the harbor or on one of the expansive beaches. If you like, take a walk along the coast or enjoy the fresh sea air with a coffee overlooking the ocean.

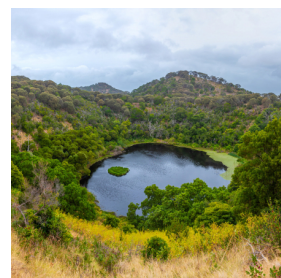
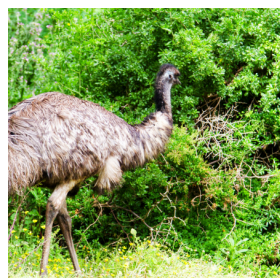
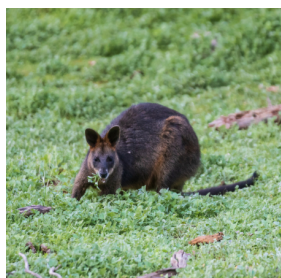

DAY 15: Port Fairy - Halls Gap

Drive to the Grampians

After breakfast, the journey continues to Halls Gap, the heart of Grampians National Park. The drive takes you through open landscapes before the distinctive sandstone cliffs of the Grampians appear on the horizon. Halls Gap, a small town surrounded by impressive mountains, is the ideal starting point to explore the nature and wildlife of the region.

In the afternoon, there is time for an initial exploration tour. A walk to Venus Baths provides a pleasant introduction to the landscape of the Grampians – along a picturesque path, shallow water basins formed between the rocks lead the way. Alternatively, the short hike to Boroka Lookout is worth it, offering a spectacular view over the valley. At dusk, kangaroos and cockatoos can often be seen near the town before the day winds down in one of the small lodges or restaurants in Halls Gap.

DAY 16: Halls Gap

The Grampians

The Grampians National Park impresses with its distinctive sandstone mountains, deep gorges, and vast eucalyptus forests. The region, known to the Indigenous people as Gariwerd, is rich in history and hosts numerous rock paintings that testify to the long culture of the Aborigines. Visitors can learn more about the traditions and spiritual significance of the Grampians at various locations while exploring the untouched nature.

The landscape of the national park offers numerous hiking trails that lead to stunning viewpoints. The Pinnacle Walk is one of the most famous routes, rewarding hikers with a spectacular view over the rugged mountain landscape. Other beautiful panoramas can be found at the Boroka Lookout and the Reeds Lookout, which offer a wide view of valleys, forests, and the plains beyond. Another highlight is the MacKenzie Falls, the largest waterfalls in the Grampians, whose thundering waters provide an impressive natural spectacle, especially after rainfall.

In addition to the impressive landscape, the wildlife is another highlight of the park. Kangaroos often graze near Halls Gap, emus roam the open areas, and koalas can be spotted in the treetops. With a bit of luck, visitors can also observe colorful parrots and cockatoos. After a busy day, the small restaurants and accommodations in Halls Gap invite guests to wind down and enjoy a relaxed evening.

DAY 17: Halls Gap - Mount Gambier



From granite to craters

Today you leave the Grampians and drive through wide, open landscapes toward Mount Gambier – a small town built on an extinct volcano. The route passes through farmland and small settlements before the first hills of South Australia appear on the horizon.

In Mount Gambier, you will find a landscape full of geological surprises: the deep blue crater lake “Blue Lake,” which changes its color depending on the season, or the Umpherston Sinkhole – a collapsed cave entrance that is now designed as a romantic garden. Those who feel like an evening walk can take the path around the Blue Lake, especially atmospheric in the light of dusk.

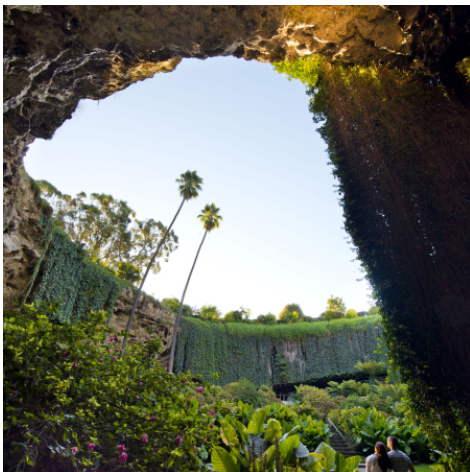

DAY 18: Mount Gambier - Coonawarra

Vines and red soil

Today you will continue on to the Coonawarra region – one of the most renowned wine-growing areas in Australia, famous for its mineral-rich, brick-red soil ("terra rossa") and characterful Cabernet Sauvignons. The drive from Mount Gambier takes just under an hour, and along the way, you will already be accompanied by expansive vineyards and historic mansions.

After your arrival at the accommodation – for example, in Penola or directly along the wine route – there will be time for initial encounters with the local wine world. Numerous wineries are located within close proximity of each other and invite you to tastings. Depending on your interests, visits to traditional establishments such as Wynns Coonawarra Estate or Balnaves of Coonawarra are recommended, as well as to smaller, family-operated wineries like Patrick of Coonawarra. Many wineries also offer small platters featuring regional cheeses or homemade specialties – ideal for a late lunch with a view of the vines.

In the evening, you can relax and conclude the day in one of the restaurants in Penola – for example, with a menu featuring seasonal ingredients from the region.

DAY 19: Coonawarra - Victor Harbor

From wine to the sea

Today you leave the vineyards of Coonawarra and head towards the southern coast to Victor Harbor – a relaxed coastal town overlooking the Fleurieu Peninsula. The route initially takes you through expansive farmland and then along Coorong National Park, a long wetland area with dunes, salt lakes, and rich birdlife. On the way, it's worth making a short stop in Robe or Kingston SE for a coffee by the sea.

In the afternoon, you will arrive in Victor Harbor – a place with colonial charm, small cafés, and the famous horse-drawn tram that leads to the offshore Granite Island. Depending on the time of arrival, there may be an opportunity for a stroll along the esplanade or a visit to the Whale Centre. Your accommodation is centrally located or offers views of the coast – ideal for a peaceful evening by the sea.

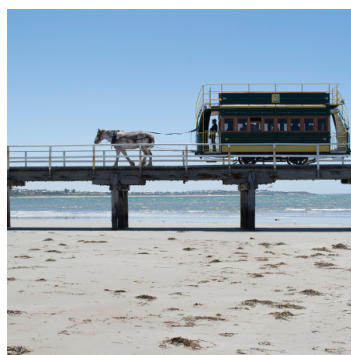

DAY 20: Victor Harbor - Kangaroo Island

Island hopping with sea lions and a wide view

Today the day starts early: You drive along the coast to the small harbor town of Cape Jervis, where the ferry departs for Kangaroo Island. The crossing takes about 45 minutes – with calm seas, a relaxed introduction to two days full of nature experiences. Your ferry also transports the vehicle, allowing you to remain flexible on the island.

After arriving in Penneshaw, a first stop at Seal Bay or the Visitor Centre is advisable to get information about current conditions and recommended routes. Depending on the location of your accommodation, you can use the afternoon to gather your first impressions: Perhaps a walk on one of the secluded beaches, a short detour to Vivonne Bay, or a visit to the Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park, where you can get up close with native animals.

The evening ends in your accommodation on the island – quiet, secluded, and with the feeling of being far away from everyday life.

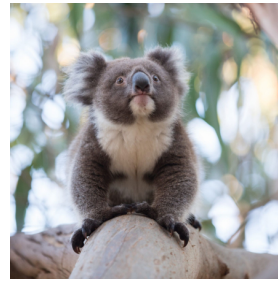

DAY 21: Kangaroo Island


Kangaroo Island Day Tour: Koalas in the Eucalyptus, Sea Lions on the Beach

Take a guided beach walk amidst a colony of rare and wild Australian sea lions with a ranger from the National Park at Seal Bay Conservation Park. Observe these wild animals up close as they frolic and lounge - a truly amazing and unforgettable experience. After a delicious two-course meal, spend the afternoon in Flinders Chase National Park.

Keep an eye out for echidnas, wallabies, reptiles, and koalas on your journey through the park. Admire the rugged coastline while hiking around Remarkable Rocks and Admirals Arch.

The Remarkable Rocks provide great photo opportunities, and the Admirals Arch Boardwalk takes you down a rugged cliff face, revealing the spectacular rock arch, a natural nursery, and a refuge for playful long-nosed fur seals. Your final visit of the day is to the Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park, where you can feed friendly kangaroos and observe the Kangaroo Island koalas up close while the animal keeper talks about the cuddly mammals.

DAY 22: Kangaroo Island - Tanunda

Back on the mainland: Welcome to the Barossa Valley

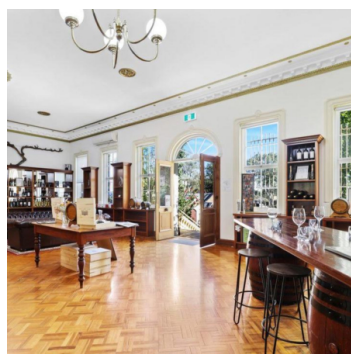

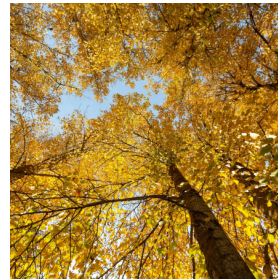
